St Mary's and the SAC are aware that the pre-Kindy and Kindy programs are an area that draws parents and students to our school. It is a point of difference to the college and the smaller supportive community is a factory that entice parents to choose St Mary's. The area is looking tired and there have been funds directed to give this space a new lease of life. Improvements have started, however, additional improvements will be made once further consultation is had regarding environmental factors around the area.
